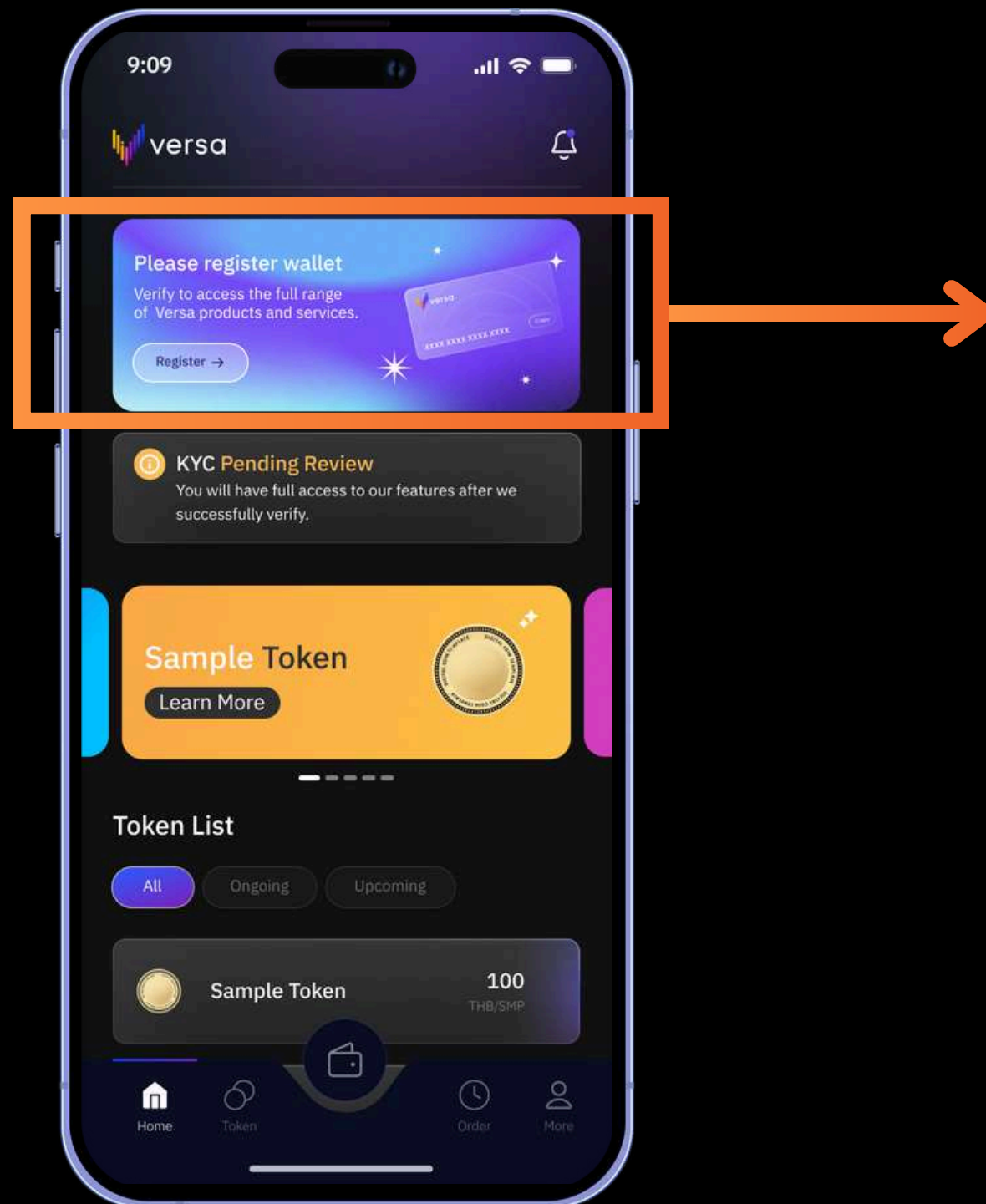


How to set up your Versa Wallet

After opening your Versa account, you will need set up your wallet before investing in tokens



Click this box to set up your **Versa Wallet**

All future ICO's, tokens, etc. that you purchase on the Versa app will be attributed to your **Versa Wallet**

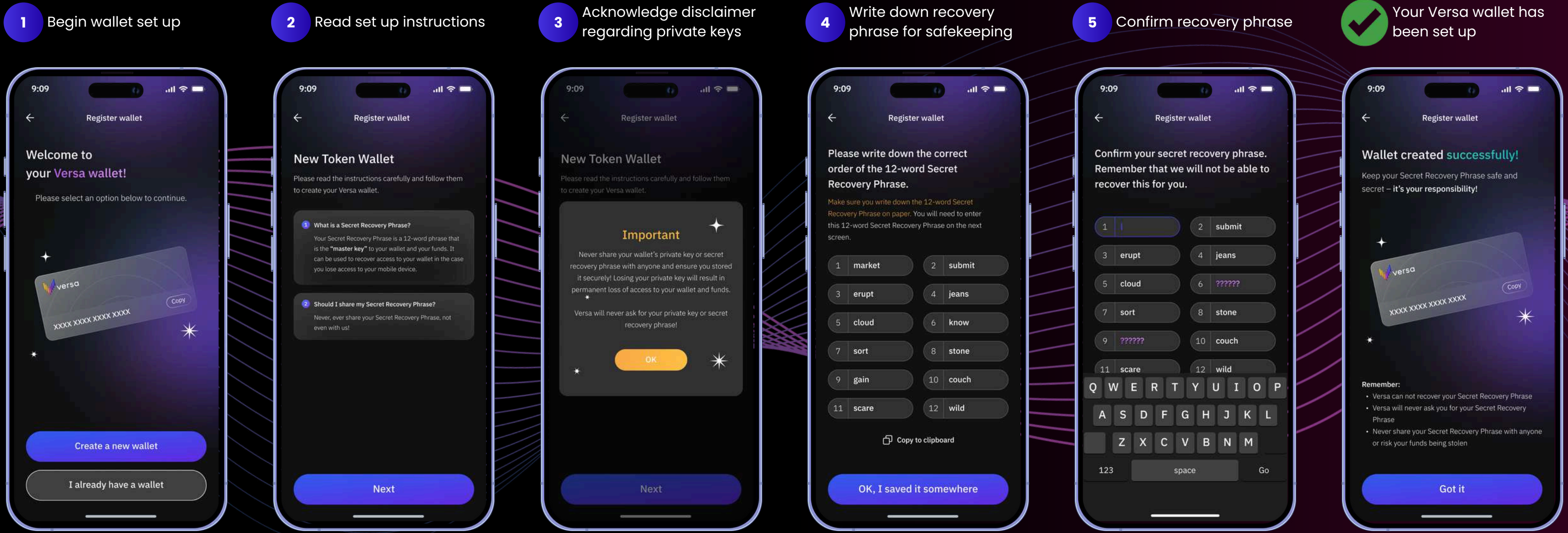
The Versa wallet is a **non-custodial wallet**

This is to ensure the **safety of your wallet and tokens**

- Your wallet private keys are known and kept only by you
- Your wallet and your tokens can only be accessed and managed by you

How to set up your Versa Wallet (cont'd)

Step-by-step process for wallet set up



DISCLAIMER

- Users should NEVER share their wallet information, private keys, or recovery phrase with anyone
- T-BOX will NEVER ask for a user's wallet information, private keys, or recovery phrase
- Users are responsible for the safekeeping of their wallet information, private keys, and recovery phrase
- If a user loses and/or exposes their wallet information to a third party, the user may lose access to their tokens

Protecting your Versa Wallet

⚠️ IMPORTANT NOTICE ⚠️

The Versa Wallet is a non-custodial wallet that is designed to ensure the safety of your wallet and tokens.

The main safety feature of the Versa Wallet (and of non-custodial wallets in general) is that the private keys for the wallet is only known by and held by the wallet owner. Since the wallet owner is the only person who knows their wallet's private keys, the wallet owner is the only person who can access and manage the wallet's tokens. Thus it is important for the wallet owner to ensure at all times that they are the only person who knows their wallet information, private keys, and recovery phrase.

Below are some best practices and things to keep in mind to protect your Versa Wallet:

- Save your wallet's recovery phrase in a secure, offline location (i.e. save it somewhere safe in a physical, written format)
- Users should NEVER share the wallet information, private keys, or recovery phrase with anyone
- T-BOX will NEVER ask for a user's wallet information, private keys, or recovery phrase

If a user loses and/or exposes their wallet information to a third party, then the user may lose access to their wallet and its tokens.

In such cases, users may contact T-BOX for assistance, and T-BOX may be able to support users on a case-by-case basis.

However, there is no guarantee a compromised wallet and its tokens can be recovered, and users must remember that they are the sole party responsible for the safekeeping of their wallet information, private keys, and recovery phrase.
